Mr. Yellott, from a select committee, reported the following bill with amendments :

A bill entitled, An act to make public a road leading from the village of Catonsville, in Baltimore county, to the Rolling road, comprising the whole of the road known as Bloombury lane, and the road now leading from the end of such lane to the said Rolling road ;

AMENDMENTS :

Amend the title by inserting after the words " An act," the following : " to amend the 3d Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto certain sections, vesting the county commissioners of Baltimore county with powers to lay out a certain road from Catonsville to the Rolling Road ;"

Strike out the preamble ;

Strike out all after the enacting clause, in the first section, and insert: " That the county commissioners of Baltimore county shall be and are hereby authorized to condemn and lay out a public road from Catonsville, in Baltimore county, to the
