AMENDMENT:

Add at the end of the 7th section: "The Legislature reserving the right to repeal, alter, or amend this law at pleasure."

AMENDMENT:

Add at the end of the 7th section: "And in no event shall any of the above amount be paid by the Treasurer, upon the warrant, unless upon evidence that each county and the city of Baltimore has furnished each a pupil to the said Female College."

Which was rejected.
