On motion of Mr. Grahame,

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns, it adjourns to meet at 12 o'clock, until further ordered.

The Senate adjourned.

Mr. Miles, from the Committee appointed to wait upon the clergy of the city of Annapolis, submitted the following report:

The Committee appointed to wait on the clergy of the respective Christian denominations in the city of Annapolis, for the purpose of inviting them to officiate, alternately, as Chaplains to the Senate, beg leave to report that they called on the Rev. Father Duffy, of the Roman Catholic Church, the Rev. Mr. Graff, of the Presbyterian Church, the Rev. Mr. Davenport, of the Episcopal Church, and the Rev. Mr. Thrush, of the Methodist Church, and that each of these gentlemen have consented to accept of the invitation of the Senate, with expressions of the highest regard for this testimonial of an indiscriminate courtesy, and it is arranged that each of these gentlemen shall officiate alternately, for the period of a week, and that the Rev. Father Duffy will attend the meeting of the Senate on the 10th, the Rev. Mr. Graff, on the 17th, the Rev. Mr. Davenport on the 24th, and the Rev. Mr. Thrush on the 31st of the present month, and in regular succession thereafter.
