Mr. McKaig submitted the following message :

By the Senate,

March 9th, 1860.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We propose, if the House of Delegates assent thereto on its part, that the action of the Legislature shall be confined to bills that have passed one or the other of the two Houses, until all such bills are disposed of, except the general appropriation bills, and to this end we propose the adoption of the following order :

Ordered, by the Senate and House of Delegates, That each House, after the reading of the Journal, will proceed to take up bills upon its table, which have passed the other House, until all such bills are disposed of, each House reserving to itself the right to give priority to general or special orders of the day, already existing, but in other respects, proceeding in accordance with this order.
