

So the Senate adopted the message.

Said message was then sent to the House of Delegates.

A bill entitled, An act to provide for printing and indexing the Code;

Was taken up.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, offered the following as additional sections:

Section 6. *And be it enacted*, That John Murphy be hereby appointed to print the said Code, and shall give bond to the State, with security approved by the said Henry C. Mackall, which bond shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State, and the terms of said contract shall be as follow: The said John Murphy shall print, for the State, one thousand copies of the two volumes of the Code, on good white paper, of equal quality with that used in the last volume of the Maryland Reports, and bound in law calf, and shall deliver the same to the Librarian, on or before the first day of July next, according to the contract made by the Joint Committee, appointed for this purpose.

Section 7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage.

Which were adopted.

The bill was then read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
