On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester,

The roll of the Senate was called, and the following Senators answered to their names:

On motion of Mr. Kimmel,

Ordered, That the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate foward to the members thereof, or to their order, by mail, at the expense of the State, all documents printed by order of the Senate, which may be received by him, after the adjournment, and that he be allowed for said service, by the Committee on Claims, the usual per diem.

On motion of Mr. Franklin,

A bill entitled, An act to refund to B. F. Anderson, executor of Wm. Anderson, deceased, money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of the State;

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
