An act to allow Richard B. Carmichael compensation for professional services, 505; passed and sent to the House, 546.

An act to pay to Eleanora B. Watkins, widow of Col. Gassaway Watkins, a captain in the American Revolution, a sum of money, 540; passed and sent to the House, 565.

An act to refund to Benjamin Fawcett a sum of money overpaid into the Treasury, 546; passed and sent to the House, 546.

A bill from the House, an act to authorize the payment of arrears of rent due Mrs. Matilda E. Green, for her house used for storage of the State's fire engine, 554; passed and returned, 627.

An act to pay William J. Roberts for services rendered in cleaning and putting in order the arms in the State armory at Easton; passed and sent to the House, 559.

A bill from the House, an act to compensate James M. Schley for legal services, 560; passed and returned, 577.

An act to compensate James W. Webster for apprehending a free negro, who was convicted for aiding and assisting a slave to run away from his owner, 562.

A bill entitled, An act to provide compensation for the several volunteer companies of this State, and the Battalion of Baltimore City Guards, who rendered services at Harper's Ferry on the 17th, 18th and 19th of October, 1859; passed and sent to the House, 576; returned, 653.
