right to sue captains and owners of vessels and steamboats in the county where they take in freight and deliver freight, and to substitute the following for the said Section;

Was considered, and

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot,

Was referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Montgomery county to record a deed from William Welling, Trustee of Presley N. Schooley;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal the 191st, 192d, 193d, 194th, 195th, 196th, and 197th Sections, relating to wild fowl, of Article 20 of the Code of Public Local Laws;
