An act to correct clerical errors upon the reprint of the Code; passed and sent to the House, 539; returned, 561.

A bill from the House, an act to amend article 55, sections 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, &c., of Code of Laws, relating to licenses for sale of spirituous or fermented liquors, &c., 554; passed and returned, 643.

An act to provide for printing and indexing the Code, 564; passed and sent to the House, 603; returned, 617.

A bill from the House, an act to repeal sections 1, 2, 3, &c., to 20, of article 19; passed and returned, 575.

COLORED POPULATION—An act to repeal the 3d and 5th sections of the 19th article of the Code, which directs an annual appropriation for the removal of free negroes from this State; reported, 75.

Petition of Elijah J. Bond, and eighty citizens of Harford county, remonstrating against the enactment of any laws enslaving negroes now free in this State, 420.

A bill from the House, an act to amend article 68 of Code of Laws, by repealing sections 42, 44, 45, 46, and by adding thereto certain sections prohibiting manumission of negro slaves, and authorizing free negroes to renounce their freedom and become slaves, 606; passed and returned, 629.

Memorial of citizens of Prince George's county, praying a remuneration to James G. Webster, for apprehending a free negro who was convicted of aiding slaves to run off, 88.

Petition of citizens of Montgomery county, relative to free negroes, 326.

An act to authorize Samuel S. Cunningham, of Washington county, to bring a negro boy into the State, 144; passed and returned, 307.

COLONIZATION SOCIETY—Leave to report a bill to repeal 3d and 5th sections of article 19 of the Code of General Public Laws, relating to the State, 69.
