TUESDAY, January 24th, 1860.

The President laid before the Senate the report of the Secretary of the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company; also,

The report of the Secretary of the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike Company; also,

The report of the Secretary of the Baltimore and Havre de Grace Turnpike Company;

Which were severally read, and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Mr. Kimmel presented the memorial of William A. Corban, P. A. Gilbert, and seventy-five other citizens of Frederick county, asking for arms;

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Militia.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented the petition of Samuel T. Hopkins, for authority to re-copy the Marriage Record of Talbot county;

Which was referred to a special committee, composed of Messrs. Goldsborough, of Talbot, Watkins and Lynch.

Mr. McKaig presented the petition of sundry citizens of Cumberland, against the passage of the bill to entitle the Clerk to the Commissioners of Allegany county to any further compensation;

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Education.

Mr. Kimmel presented the following order:

Ordered, That the Committee on Judicial Proceedings be instructed to inquire into the expediency and propriety of such action by the General Assembly, as will defer the operation of the Code, and the subsequent amendments thereto which have been made by this General Assembly, until the first day of June next, and that said Committee report thereon by bill or otherwise;

Which was laid over informally.

On motion of Mr. Gardiner,

Leave was granted Messrs. Gardiner, Smith and McKaig, to introduce a bill to repeal the 3d and 5th Sections, relating to the State Colonization Society, of Article 19 of the Code of General Public Laws.
