Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. McKaig, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported the following bill:

An act to repeal the 143d section, chapter 14, of the Public Local Laws of Kent county;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Gardiner, from a select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to repeal the 3rd and 5th sections of the 19th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, which directs an annual appropriation, not exceeding ten thousand dellars, for the removal of free negroes from this State;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. Kimmel submitted the following message:
