Mr. Smith, from the Committee on the Constitution, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorize the Comptroller of the Treasury to adjust and settle the accounts of the inspectors of grain, with the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED:

After the enacting clause, insert "That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the inspector general, and the inspectors of grain for the city of Baltimore, the amount of money paid by them into the Treasury, provided the same, or the amounts received by them, shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars to the inspector general, and two thousand dollars to each of the other inspectors.

Which was adopted, and the bill was read the second time.
