son, and over 3,000 other citizens of Baltimore, praying against the passage of the Police and Election bills;

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on the Constitution.

The hour for the order of the day having arrived,

A bill entitled. An act to repeal the 706th section of the 4th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, which gives to the Mayor of the city of Baltimore, and the Judge of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, and the Judge of the Superior Court of Baltimore, the power to order out the Militia;

Was put upon its second reading.

Mr. Kimmel moved to strike out the enacting clause.

Mr. Yellott demanded the year and nays, which appeared as follow :
