I unite with you, in imploring the interposition of the God of Daniel, in favor of our beloved, but distracted country.

Our relations have been pleasant, gentlemen; and as the duties of business have made us known to each other, friendships have grown up, which make this hour sad—sad because 'tis always sorrowful to part from friends, even though we part to go to friends.

The hour for separation will shortly have arrived by the prescribed terms of our constitution; and, gentlemen, I return you all, members and officers, my sincere acknowledgments for your uniform courtesy extended to me in official and private intercourse, and in conclusion assure you that in all time to come I shall look back to the session of 1864, with pride and pleasure.
