oath was required by the military authorities of the United States as a qualification of voters, in violation of the Constitution and Laws of this State, or that military forces, either of the State of Maryland or of the United States, were marshalled near said polls or voting places, in violation of the laws of this State, for the purpose of intimidating voters," the Governor shall thereupon withhold his proclamation declaring whether a majority of the votes, as required by this act, have been cast for or against a convention, until a fair election has been held in such election districts of the several counties and wards or voting precincts of Baltimore city as the returns of the said judges of election show either an unlawful oath was put or military interference existed, as hereinbefore set forth, and the Governor shall thereupon issue his proclamation ordering a new election in every such election district in the several counties, or wards or voting precincts in Baltimore, the same to be held within ten days after the issuing of said proclamation, and subject to the provisions herein contained, regulating the election under this act, and the said judges of election shall return the votes cast at such election, in the mode and manner herein provided, and the Governor shall from time to time order such new election until he shall receive returns from all the judges of election in the several counties, and the city of Baltimore, showing there has been an election in all the election districts in the several counties, and in all the voting precincts or wards of Baltimore city, free from the requirement of any unlawful oath by military authority, or from interference by the military, as hereinbefore set forth, and upon his receiving the full returns, certified to as hereinbefore required, and not before, he shall issue his proclamation declaring the number of votes cast "for convention," and "against convention."

Mr. Clarke demanded the yeas and nays.

The demand being sustained, the year and nays were called, and appeared as follow:
