Sent to the Senate announcing the appointment of Rev. Mr. Davenport and Rev. Mr. Owen as Chaplains to the House, proposing an interchange of services with the Chaplain appointed by the Senate, 13 ; agreed to by the Senate, 23 ; sent to the Senate asking for a joint Committee to confer, with a view of procuring a supply of the Code and Supplement, 14 ; agreed to by the Senate, 23.

From the Senate appointing the Secretary of the Senate and Chief Clerk of the House, to superintend the arrangement of the Hall, and for the furnishing of stationery for the use of the Constitutional Convention, 578 ; assented to, 839.
