Ways and Means, 900; read the second time, 932; read the third time and passed, 981.

Senate bill to provide for a subscription to Win-gate's Register, read the first time and referred to the Committee on, 900; read the second time, 922; read the third time and rejected, reconsidered, 983; read the third time and passed, 997.

Bill to repeal section 4 of Article 64, and section 2 of Article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws, as to repeal the tax on mortgages and judgments, read the third time and rejected, 928.

Leave granted the Committee on, to report a bill to donate one hundred thousand dollars for Public Schools, 362; bill reported and read the first time, 664.

Bill reported favorably by the Committee on, fix-ing the compensation of the Crier of the Court of Appeals, read first time, 364; read the third time and passed, 679.

Petition of citizens of Charles County, asking for the repeal of certain tax laws, referred to the Com-mittee on, 375.

Senate bill relating to licenses requiring sheriffs to furnish lists, referred to the Committee on, 377; reported unfavorably on and read the second time, 559; read the third time and rejected, 845.

Leave granted the Committee on, to report a bill relating to auction sales in Baltimore city, 385.

Bill reported favorably to amend sections 23, 46, and 103 of article 81 of the Code of General Laws, entitled revenue and taxes, read first time, 391; read second time, 466; read third time and passed, 531.

Also, a bill for the reduction of the amount of the stocks of the State now held to the credit of the sinking fund, 391; read second time, 466; read third and passed, 531; returned from the Senate amended, amendment concurred in and passed, 792.
