Mayer and Lewis Mayer; provided, the price thereof shall not exceed \$5 per copy; and the Librarian is further directed to distribute the same number of copies of said Digest, and in the same way as the copies of the Maryland Reports are now by law authorized to be distributed, and the residue to sell or exchange for such other books as may be required in the State Library; provided, nevertheless, that he shall retain thirty-five copies in the Library, for the use thereof;
