the House the reading by the title shall be consider the first reading; and when such bill is reported from a committee the reading by the title shall be considered the second reading, unless some member shall require it to be read through, and the same may be amended on the third reading, if required by any member;

Mr. Handy, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to allow Thomas Sudlar, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county further time to complete his collections, and to give him power to do so;"

Mr. Trail, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to require the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick county to make and prepare a general index to the Land Records of said county during the term of Benjamin G. Fitzhugh, clerk, and to require said clerk and his successors in office to continue said index during their respective terms;'

Mr. Stevens, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to provide for re-copying, re-binding and re-indexing the records in the office of the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, for Baltimore city, and to make and keep
