Average time those discharged were in the Institution: boys,  $27\frac{1}{4}$  months; girls,  $20\frac{3}{4}$  months.

Average number in the institution during the year: boys,  $273\frac{1}{2}$ ; girls, 35; total,  $308\frac{1}{2}$ .

Of the 33 boys indentured, 15 were to farmers, 1 as clerk, 8 to shoemakers, 1 to blacksmith, 1 to baker, 2 to woolen manufacturers, 2 to millers, 2 to gardeners, and 1 to machinist.

The 7 girls indentured were all to housewifery.

100 boys and 18 girls received this year were committed by Justices of the Peace from Baltimore City, 2 boys by the Baltimore City Criminal Court, 1 boy by the Circuit Court of Washington County, 5 boys and 2 girls by Justices of Peace of Baltimore County, 1 girl from Kent County, 1 boy from Washington County, 1 boy from Howard County, and 8 boys and 2 girls received as boarders.
