

TEACHERS' REPORT OF BOYS' SCHOOL.

To the School and Chapel Committee:

For the attainments of those who have been received and discharged, during the year, we refer you to the ninth Table of the Superintendent's Report.

The schools are divided into four divisions.

The first division, in charge of F. D. Morrison, contains 88 boys, all of whom receive instruction in Reading, Writing, Orthography, Geography, and Written and Mental Arithmetic, while the more advanced classes are also taught Grammar and Natural Philosophy.

The second division, in charge of Miss Kate Mahon, contains 70 boys, and is divided into three classes. The first and second classes study Geography, Arithmetic, Reading, Writing and Spelling. The third class cypher in Addition and Subtraction, read easy lessons, write on slates, and spell in monosyllables.

The third division contains 75 boys, and is taught by Miss Mary A. Patrick; it is divided into four classes, three of which study Geography and write in Copy-Books. The first class is
