

of the western division; and are now employed in procuring materials for the continuance of the work during the current year.

They have completed such farm buildings as were deemed to be now necessary for the wants of the farm; have continued to construct suitable roads, and prosecuted the farm operations with the view to put the land in a condition to meet the demands of the Asylum.

A full account of the receipts and expenditures during the fiscal year ending on 30th November, 1862, and of the assets and pecuniary condition of the Corporation, will be found in the account or statement certified by the President thereof, which accompanies this report, and to which reference is made for more particular information.
