Sir :

I deem it proper, in addition to the enclosed, to state that many of those gentlemen referred to as having been refused an opportunity to vote in the 2nd Election District of Worcester County, were persons of the highest respectability in our County, some of our largest tax payers, church members, who are ornaments of their Christian profession, and of unimpeachable integrity—and that undue and improper efforts were made to prevent almost every person from voting the Conservative Union Ticket, whilst every facility was allowed all (even many who were not legally entitled) to vote the radical ticket, who were believed to be inclined to do so, in this district, and the reports from many of the other districts of the County are of an equally, or more, reprehensible character than transpired at our polls.
