they did, and, in consequence, only about a two-third vote was cast in this district. At other polls in the County, similar outrages were committed, and even greater ones, all of which will be presented to you in a few days. I have thought it my duty to inform you of these facts, and to enter my earnest protest against the legality of the election thus held.

The outraces perpetuated on the Ballot Box in this Country on Wednesday last, has induced me to briefly inform you of the Gen'l Schenok, No. 53, as modified by the President of the United States and your Proclamatica to the people of Maryland. were both treated as a addity by the Density Provest Marshall (Wrs. Henderson) at the golla held in this district. No. 1. (Caston's) and the whole matter conducted as he saw account Loval voters were arrested, without accuration, herore they could vote, while other were not poerrifted to come to the ballet box, but were ordered, peremptorily to leave the polic. one case a voter, after he had taken the outh of allegionee, was ordered from the ballot box before his vote could be deposited. and the Judges of Election informed that if they took his balled Indees, which threat intimideted them, and the bullet was not taken. The action in this case prevented a unaber from sorting. the people saving, that if they could not vote after they had taken the outh of allogrance, that they would retire which
