Witness at the polls of Election, one of the Judges of Election
in the District Court (No. 10) District of Kansas
Nov. 4, 1863, at Lawrence, Mo. 1863

We the Judges of Election reached the place of voting at
and District Court at 10 o'clock, A. M., and we found a number of
easily read, contents of a permanent, fully printed. They re-
mained there during the day, around about the ballot boxes, one
at least always being present.

The ballots were before we opened the polls, that all who
wrote the name (or names) of the ticket, until after the oath had
been sworn to, and in obedience to his order, the oath was
administered to all such. Persons taking the Democratic ticket
or the Union (Lawson) ticket were not required to swear,
their ticket was by his order examined, and it is certified
that on the 4th of Nov. was required to swear before he was
allowed to vote. We polled only 19 votes. The full vote of the
District is about 110 votes.
