Which was read the first time.

Mr. Barron, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, “An Act to prohibit the granting of licenses for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at or near Woodberry factory, in Baltimore county;”

Which was read the first time.

Also, favorably, Senate bill entitled, “An Act to amend the 4th article of Public Local Law, relating to jurors in the city of Baltimore;”

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Fawcett, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, “An Act to amend the 15th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the power of the commissioners of the town of Rockville, by repealing section 66 of said article, and re-enacting the same with amendments;”

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Biggs, from a select committee, reported favorably Senate bill entitled, “An Act to make valid the devise made in the last will and testament of Christianna Scholl, late of Frederick county, deceased, to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Frederick, in Frederick city, Maryland.”

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Trail, from a select committee, reported favorably Senate bill entitled, “An Act to amend the charter of the Franklin Savings Bank of Frederick, and to increase their capital stock;”

Which was read the second time.

The bill entitled, “An Act to regulate the compensation of the State’s Attorney for Worcester county;”

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, “An Act to make valid a deed from Henry Walker, guardian to Thomas Cox, of Dearborn county, in the State of Indiana, to Isaac Nichols, of Somerset county, and to authorize the clerk of the Circuit court for Somerset county, to record the same.”

Was read the second time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.
