So the amendment was rejected.

Mr. Griffith offered the following amendment:

Sec. 8, line 2. Strike out all after "shall," line 2, to "for," and insert, "be satisfied that a majority of all the legal votes of the State are cast;"

Which was rejected.

Mr. Murray, of Baltimore city, offered the following amendment:

Amend section 8, line 7, by striking out the words "fully" and finished;" they being superfluous;

Which was rejected.

Mr. Trail offered the following amendment:

Sec. 8. After the word "compensation," in 7th line, add, "of the President of said convention shall be six dollars a day, and;"

Which was rejected.

Mr. Buhrman offered the following amendment:

Amend 8th line, 8th section, by striking out the word "five" out of the 8th line, and inserting the word "four."
