

REPORT.

The Committee appointed by the House of Delegates at January Session, 1864, to examine into and report to this General Assembly the condition of the State Tobacco Warehouse in the city of Baltimore, have agreed upon and do make the following report:

WAREHOUSE NO. 1.

They take pleasure in saying, they commenced their labors by examining Warehouse No. 1, James T. Perkins, Esq., Inspector, being present, conducted us through the building which we found in good condition, with a few exceptions, which will hereafter be named.
