

STATEMENT A.

To the Stockholders of the Annapolis and Elkridge Railroad Company:

The President and Directors thereof, in compliance with the provisions of the charter, submit this their Report for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1863, as follows, viz:

The revenue of the Company for the year actually received has been from passengers, freight, Adams' Express, transportation of the United States mails, rent of Junction House, and from all other sources,.....	\$49,436 79

The disbursements during the same period have been for salaries of President, Secretary and Treasurer, and Superintendent, and for wages of Conductor, Engineer, and other employees of the Road, for repairing passenger cars, culverts and road bed, for gas, wood, wood sawing, coal, cross ties, spikes and chairs, castings, carpenters' wages, working passenger and freight trains, United States internal revenue tax, cutting wood standing in the woods, hauling wood, contingent and incidental expenses, insurance, and for day and night watchmen, &c.....
