The House resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, "An Act to provide for taking the sense of the people of Maryland, upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of Government, for the State, to and provide for the election of Delegates to said Convention;"

On motion of Mr. Claude,

The House resolved itself into a committee of the Whole for the consideration of the bill last.

After some time spent in committee of the Whole, the committee rose, the Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Frazier, chairman, reported that they had had under consideration the bill entitled. "An Act to provide for taking the sense of the people upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of Government for the State of Maryland; and to provide for the election of Delegates to said Convention;" had made no progress thereon, and asked leave to sit again;

Which report was concurred in.
