Mr. Barron, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to repeal sections seven hundred and ninety-eight, seven hundred and ninety-nine, and eight hundred and two of article four of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto, relating to the abatement of nuisances;"
