Which was read the first time.

Mr. Ireland, from a select committee, reported favorably Senate bill entitled, "An act to make valid the last will and testament of Benjamin Guill, free negro, late of Calvert county, deceased, and to authorize his widow and devisee to hold and dispose of the property thereby devised;"

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Jones, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An act to add a new section to article eight of Public Local Laws, entitled 'Roads;'"

Which was read the first time.

The Order of the Day, the bill entitled, "An Act to provide for taking the sense of the people upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of Government for the State, and to provide for the election of delegates to said Convention;"

Was taken up.

Said bill being upon its third reading;

On motion of Mr. Herbert,

The House went into committee of the Whole to consider the bill.

After some time spent in committee of the Whole, the committee rose, the Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Frazier, chairman of the committee of the Whole House, reported that they had had under consideration the bill entitled, "An Act to provide for taking the sense of the people upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of Government for the State, and to provide for the election of delegates thereto;" they reported the bill back to the House, with a recommendation that it pass;

The bill was then read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
