On motion of Mr. Claude,

Leave was granted the committee on Claims to report a bill to pay John Glover \$20, for services rendered to the State, as will appear from the certificate of the clerk of the committee on Claims, dated December 20th, 1861.

On motion of Mr. Duncan,

Leave was granted the committee on Claims to introduce a bill to authorize the State Treasurer to pay to John Bishop, former sheriff of Worcester county, certain money erroneously paid by him into the State Treasury.

Leave was granted the Queen Anne's and Kent county delegations to report a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's and Kent counties to contract with some person for the repair of the bridge over Chester river, at Crumpton.

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to make valid a deed from Elizabeth Gearhart and others to Joel W. Marsh,

Leave was granted the Prince George's county delegation to introduce a bill to increase the compensation of the crier of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county.
