The bill entitled, “An Act for the relief of Molten Plummer, to authorize the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Caroline county to record a certain deed ;”

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

The enacting clause of the bill was stricken out.

The Senate bill entitled, “An Act to authorize Benjamin Mason, of Harford county, to act in the double capacity of Justice of the Peace and Postmaster ;”

The Senate bill entitled, “An Act to repeal sections 42 and 43 of article 66 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to ‘Manumission,’ and to enact a substitute therefor, providing for the manumission of Slaves ;”

The bill entitled, “An Act appropriating a sum of money to pay the members of the Williamsport Guards, a military company, engaged in protecting the Public works ;”

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled, “An Act to repeal the 4th section of the 12th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to ‘Banks ;’”

Was read the second time.

The bill entitled, “An Act to change the name of Samuel Robertson, of Charles county, to Samuel Cox ;”
