Mr. Claude offered the following amendment :

Section 1st, on line 69, after the word "elections," insert "and the Governor shall not announce the result of the votes cast for or against a Convention, nor shall the Convention assemble and organize for the transaction of business until regular returns are received from the Judges of election in the city of Baltimore and in the several counties of this State certifying that no organized or other military force has appeared at the place where the polls are held or interfered with the said election, but when elections have been held in the city of Baltimore, and in the several counties unobstructed by any organized or other military force, and this fact has been certified without qualification in the returns made by all the judges of election in the several counties and the city of Baltimore, then if the majority of votes cast are for a Convention, the Governor shall issue his proclamation to assemble and organize the Convention, within ten days from the time when said vote is announced ;"

Mr. Boswell offered the following amendment to the amendment :

In 6th line of amendment, strike out "the several counties of the State," and insert "a majority of the counties of the State ;"

Which was rejected.

The question then recurring upon the adoption of the amendment,
