Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Washington County Railroad Company.

On motion of Mr. Shaw,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Pennsylvania and Potomac Railroad Company.

On motion of Mr. Waters,

Leave was granted the committee on Inspections to introduce a bill to repeal all the sections in article four of the Code of Public Local Laws in reference to the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, beginning at section four hundred and ninety-five, and ending with section five hundred ;

On motion of Mr. Murray, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted a select committee of three to introduce a bill to enable the Baltimore Humane Impartial Society and Aged Women's Home to provide suitable homes for indigent old men, as well as for old women, and to otherwise enlarge the sphere of their benevolent operations ;
