Mr. Starr presented a petition from John Smith and others' commissioners under an Act passed March 2nd, 1860, incorporating the Uniontown Turnpike Company, asking for the passage of a law to authorize said company to make agreements with the Westminster and Hagerstown Turnpike Company, for collection of tolls;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Sheep and Dogs.

Mr. Tolson presented a petition from W. L. Starkey, Vachel Downs, Samuel T. Earle and Jas. T. Earle, to be released from interest on Clinton Wright's collection bond, in District No. 3, Queen Anne's county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.

The petition of Frank H. Stockett, unfavorably reported by the committee on Claims;

Was recommitted to that committee.

Mr. Hoffman presented a petition from Ellen Maria Cockey to refund to the heirs of Col. Edward Cockey, certain money paid by him for the use of the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.

Mr. Brown presented a petition of eighty citizens of Barton, Allegany county, remonstrating against the passage of a law to sell certain real estate in Westernport district, for the benefit of the Methodist church;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Stockbridge presented a memorial from Thomas Ken-sett and two hundred and twenty other citizens of Maryland, praying a modification of the law relating to the measurement of Oysters in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Fisheries and Oysters.
