The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The bill entitled, "An Act to refund to Stephen R. Gore, late collector of taxes in Carroll county, a sum of money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of the State;"

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to make valid a deed from Robert Moore to Robert Craig;"

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled "An Act to authorize Joshua Dill, administrator of Jacob Hill, a free negro, deceased, to pay over the balance upon settlement of the final account of the estate of said deceased, to Richard H. Murdock, of Frederick county, in trust for the use and benefit of George Hill, son of said Jacob Hill, who is the slave of said Murdock;"

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to repeal sections 197, 203 and 207, of article 8, Public Local Laws, entitled, 'Cecil county,' relating to 'Schools,' and re-enact the same with amendments:"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to enable the Mayor and Common Council of the city of Westminster to enclose an alley in said city, running parallel with Court street in said city, and sell or otherwise dispose of the same;"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

\* The bill entitled, "An Act to refund to Julia Gittings, administratrix of Thomas E. Gittings, deceased, certain taxes erroneously paid;"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, "An Act to amend article 71 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Oysters,' regulating the taking and catching of Oysters within the waters of this State;"

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading;
