Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to amend article 45 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Husband and Wife;'

Also, leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to amend section thirty-two of article 93 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Testamentary Law, regulating administration on the estates of married women;'

Also, leave was granted the committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Chesapeake and Potomac Canal Company;

Also, leave was granted the committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to add a supplement to the act incorporating the Baltimore United Fire Department, passed at December session 1833, chapter 187, for the purpose of providing relief for the sick and indigent, and the families of the sick and indigent members of the said organization;

Also, leave was granted a select committee of three to introduce a bill to provide for a military agency or agencies for promoting the welfare and comfort of the soldiers of this State, in the field, or in hospitals.

On motion of Mr. Trail,

Leave was granted the committee on Militia to introduce a bill to declare the intent and purpose of the third section of the act antitled, "An Act to encourage enlistments of volunteers into Maryland Regiments in the United States army."
