records and papers destroyed or injured by fire in the office of the clerk of the Circuit court of Baltimore county;"

Which was read the first time.

The hour having arrived, the first Order of the Day, being the bill entitled, "An Act to repeal sections 44, 45 &c. of article 66 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Negroes;'"

Was taken up,

Mr. Trail moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill.

Mr. Herbert demanded the yeas and nays;
