The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, "An Act to add the following section to article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Crimes and Punishments,' defining the offence of being a common thief and pickpocket;"

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

A bill entitled, "An Act to add the following sections to article four of Public Local Laws, subject of 'Police of Baltimore city,' in relation to the trial and discharge of persons arrested by the police;"

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Stockbridge, Lee and Murray, of Baltimore city.

A bill entitled, "An Act to authorize and require the Comptroller to draw a warrant upon the Treasurer of Maryland to pay William W. Johnson the sum of one hundred and eighty-nine dollars, balance due on over payment made to Thomas Sudler, Sheriff of Somerset county, on State and county tax of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine and eighteen hundred and sixty;"

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Claims.

A bill entitled, "An Act to add a new section to article eighty-one of the Code of Public General Laws, exempting parsonages from taxes;"

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
