Mr. Pierce, of Queen Anne's county, from the committee on Printing, submitted the following

## REPORT:

The committee on Printing beg leave to report that they are unable to agree with Messrs. Bull & Tuttle, the Printers elected to this House, upon terms as advantageous to the State as those agreed upon by the Senate, and being unwilling to assume the responsibility of contracting at higher rates of compensation than that paid by the Senate, we deemed it advisable to report the facts to the House, and ask to be instructed in the matter.
