Also, favorably a bill entitled, “An Act to amend an act entitled, ‘An Act to incorporate the United States Land Company, passed at the January session, 1860, chapter 349, by enlarging the powers granted in said act;”

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Stubbs, from a select committee, reported favorably a Senate bill entitled, “An Act for the better protection of the people of the State against the ravages of small-pox;”

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Ecker, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, “An Act to provide for the general valuation and assessment of property in Carroll county;”
