Which was assented to and sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the following House bill:

A bill entitled, "An Act appropriating a sum of money to pay the members of the Williamsport Guards, a military company, engaged in protecting the public works;"

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays;"

Also, delivered the following Senate bill:

A bill entitled. "An Act to change and alter School Districts numbers 20 and 21 in Caroline county, so as to attach the following described district to the Opossum Hill School District, and electing trustees for the same;"

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Ridgaway, Kerr and Stubbs.

Mr. Gantz, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to repeal sections one hundred and twenty-four of article twenty-one of the Public Local Laws, relating to the town of Hagerstown, and to re-enact the same with an amendment, authorizing the Mayor and city Council to light up the streets of said town ;"

Which was read the first time.
