Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to authorize the clerks to the county commissioners for the several counties of this State, authority to probate accounts coming before their bodies.

On motion of Mr. Greene,

Leave was granted the Allegany county delegation to introduce a bill authorizing the commissioners of Allegany county, to appoint superintendents of a public road in said county, and to make special levies for said road.

On motion of Mr. Davis,
