The resolutions were then taken up for a second reading.

Strike out the words "loyal owners," and insert: "all who own slaves, and have not engaged in actual hostilities against the Government of the United States, or given aid and comfort to those engaged in hostilities against said Government,"

The question being upon the adoption of the amendment,

Mr. Barron demanded the yeas and nays,

The demand being sustained,
