Also, a bill entitled, "An Act to repeal the fourth section of the twelfth Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Banks."

Which were read and referred to the committee on Currency.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning at 11 o'clock.

## FRIDAY, January 15, 1864.

The House met, and was opened with prayer by the Rev. Mr. Owen, Chaplain of the House.
