The General Assembly of Maryland:

GENTLEMEN:—In accordance with duty, we have examined the condition of the State Library, and find many of the books on the second and third tiers injured by the very great dampness of the walls.

We recommend that the interior walls be lined with boards, well painted on each side, and that the alcove and closets not yet fitted up, be finished.

We respectfully recommend an appropriation of one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to protect the books and finish the alcove and closets, and that the work be done under the supervision of the State Librarian.
