Leave was granted the Baltimore city and county delegations to introduce a bill to provide for the payment of the grading of North avenue, from Pennsylvania avenue to the Northern Central railway, in the city of Baltimore, and for assessing the costs and expenses thereof upon the property benefitted thereby, and the owners thereof.

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to make valid a certain deed from Elizabeth Gearhart and others to Joel W. Marsh; also, a deed from Michael Jones and wife to Henry Rowland; and also, a deed from Michael Jones and wife to John Feidt.

Also, Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to make valid a deed from John Derr and wife, of Washington county, to Normand B. Scott, of the same county.

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill to provide for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State.
