Which was adopted.

Mr. Waters offered the following order:

Ordered, That the Speaker be and he is hereby authorized to appoint three Pages to this House, a Lamplighter and Hall Keeper.

Mr. Westcott moved to amend by inserting two, instead of three Pages.

Which was rejected.

The order was then adopted.

Mr. Trail offered the following order:

Ordered, That the organization of the House be completed by swearing in the officers;

Which was adopted.
